


OUR PHILOSOPHY AND OBJECTIVES

Gelisim College teachers have continuously been participating in educational seminars since 1996. These seminars focus on student based teaching techniques, creative teaching methods, question strategies and individual development programs. In addition to their academic achievements, our teachers; know their students well, are open to change, are good models for the students with their visions, and have good communication skills.

Enrollment

A limited number of students are admitted to the high school each year, on the basis of their achievement in the highly competitive national exam taken about one million students, as well as their performance in a consequent interview with academic staff and school counselor.

Faculty

- 40 full-time teaching staff. 10 hold master degree and 2 doctoral degree.
- Student to teacher ratio 6,4:1 and average class size is 18

Students

274 students are in high school and 25% have scholarships.







Curriculum

- Our students follow a 4-year high school program.
- Students begin high school in 9th grade, following a common core curriculum in grades 9 and 10. From 11th grade onward, the curriculum diversifies into four specific diploma tracks: Science and Math, Math and Turkish, Turkish and Social Sciences, and Foreign Languages.
- Students in the Science and Math and Turkish and Math tracks pursue an advanced mathematics curriculum that includes Algebra, Trigonometry, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, and Calculus.

Extra-Curricular Academic Programs

- Gelisim offers Advanced Placement (AP) program for English literature, mathematics, biology, human geography, physics, chemistry and world history.
- Gelisim offers IELTS-based English course.




Grading

Students obtain grades at the end of each semester and the final year grade is the average of the two semesters' grades.

GPAs are weighted and they are calculated by multiplying the exam grades by the number of course hour of each subject.

The passing mark is 50%. High honors degree is obtained by a weighted average of 85%.




Gelisim reports ranking GPA is calculated by weighting each subject based on its hours of study per week. The grading corresponds to;

School Clubs



Gelişim High School students actively participate in a wide range of after-school programs covering a variety of activities in the fields of sports (basketball, futsal, volleyball, horse riding, snooker, cardio exercises and gymnastics), fine arts (performing arts, visual arts, digital arts) (art, cinema, dubbing). Our students take part in science and technology (robotics, scientific projects, scuba diving, mathematics and science), community service (CAS), personal development (thought platform), internationally based programs (Italian scholarship program, PASCH, MUN, DI, Young Reporters, ISTA, GEF, TEDx) and academic support, as well as the most popular clubs such as MUN giving students the chance to complete at national and international level. Entrepreneurship club aims at developing students' leadership skills and performing arts include drama, school symphony orchestra and pop band. Visual arts clubs include pottery, graphics and design, body art and animation. School clubs are supported by the school's facilities built on 25,000 m2 of green area and a conference hall for 382 people. The school has excellent sports facilities including a National League Two Basketball Stadium, Sports Hall, Volleyball Stadium, outdoor basketball and football fields.



Community Service

Since the 2013-2014 academic year, community service has been an important part of the school's educational program. Every student at Gelişim College must perform at least 30 and at most 80 hours of community service in a year. They may choose to participate in one or more of a variety of community service activities, such as helping refugee families, motivating and supporting sick children in hospitals, or organizing a charity program for children with leukemia. Every year, students organize the "Not Without You" event to provide financial aid for different organizations. This program aims to motivate children throughout their treatment period and provide their families with clothes, food, toys or any supplies they need. The "Young Spokespersons of the Environment" program is an international program that provides environmental education in order to direct our students to understand environmental problems and issues and to raise their awareness.





Portfolio Development

Based on the founding philosophy of Gelişim College, a new structure aimed at cultivating students who possess productivity, a sense of belonging, personal goals, and strong organizational and management skills has been created. The department will aid not only the development of students' overall progress but it will also support university application processes and help develop their academic and social skills.





University Acceptances since 2014



As the opportunities for studying abroad have increased and our school's success has grown both academically and socially, 30% of our students have been accepted into universities. There are many reasons for this, particularly our the high overall success rates and school's average IELTS score of 7 which have opened the doors to studying abroad. Many of our students who have received offers from various universities have enrolled in the institutions they desired and aimed for.
